#### TODAY'S READINGS

#### First Reading: Am 8:4-7

Unfair business practices and injustice to the poor will be judged by God.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 113:1-2, 4-8

### PRAISE THE LORD, WHO RAISES THE POOR FROM THE DUST.

#### Second Reading: 1Tim 2:1-8

Paul tells Timothy that prayer for those in authority is pleasing to God because God wills the salvation of all.

#### Gospel Reading: Lk 16:1-13 or 16:10-13

Jesus tells a parable about a dishonest steward who is commended for his prudence; one cannot serve both God and money.

#### REFLECTION

A steward is dismissed because he is squandering his master's property in today's gospel. The passage concludes with three morals for the listeners. The first exhorts the listener to be prudent about the use of wealth. Christians should handle the affairs of temporal life with an eye toward attaining Heaven. The second concerns trustworthiness. Those who can be trusted in small things can also be trusted in great things. If Christians handle money and other passing things responsibly, then they can also be trusted with the affairs of the Kingdom of God. Finally, Jesus tells his listeners that no one can serve two masters simultaneously. God must be put ahead of money.

### **Divorce and Annulment**

Q. My parents are getting divorced. I don't understand why the church doesn't allow that. My mother told me they will be getting an annulment. What will my parents' annulment have to do with me?

A. Divorce is a very difficult part of life when it happens. I'm sure this is very difficult for your mom and dad as it must be for you. Please know that our loving God wants to be there for you and your family throughout this time.

The answer to the first question you ask, "Why doesn't the Church allow that" is found in the Bible. First, we read in the book of Genesis, "That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one body" (Genesis 2:24). Then, in the Gospels Jesus makes reference to this and confirms it when He answers a question about divorce. He says, "...from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate" (Mark 10:6-9).

These Scriptures give us the foundation for what our Church believes about marriage. Basically, we believe that when two people get married they enter into a permanent unbreakable bond that last's until death. Of course some marriages within our Church do end in divorce. When that happens some will look into an annulment. This is a complicated subject that is best dealt with one on one with your parish priest but let me at least offer a basic understanding on annulments for you. **To be continued...**


May your Mother Mary intercede for us and may the Archangel Michael defend us in battle. We make our payer through Christ our Lord and Redeemer.

Approaching the boy, the man asked what he was doing. "The starfish will die if they're still on the shore when the sun rises," he replied.


