TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: 2Mac 7:1-2, 9-14

Jewish martyrs give witness to their faith, even unto death.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 17:1, 5-6,8b

WHEN I AWAKE, O LORD, I SHALL BE FILLED WITH THE VISION OF YOUR PRESENCE.

Second Reading: 2Thes 2:16-3-5

Paul encourages the Thessalonians and asks for their prayers.

Gospel Reading: Lk 20:27-38 or 20:27, 34-38

Jesus answers a question from some Sadducees about the resurrection of the dead.

REFLECTION

In today's Gospel, we hear about an encounter between Jesus and some Sadducees. The Sadducee, teachers of the law unlike the Pharisees did not believe in the resurrection. They used the example of Levirate marriage, found in the Law of Moses, to disprove belief in the resurrection. Jesus argues from the same written Law of Moses to show that there is resurrection. Using the texts from the Book of Exodus 3 that describe Moses' encounter with God in the burning bush, Jesus shows that God is the God of the living, not the dead. Here Jesus uses the same method and texts of the Sadducees to counter them. As the Gospel text suggests, he beat them at their own game! Subsequently, Jesus suggests to them not to spend time worrying about resurrected life as by so doing they will miss the point. The focus is to live a worthy life knowing that there is a life hereafter with our Maker where we will enjoy heavenly bliss.

MARKS OF THE CHURCH CATHOLIC - Cont'd

The same is true for all world religions. We do not reject anything of other religions that is true. For example, if someone were to say, "My religion teaches we should love all people." We'd say, "Great!" By the fact they accept this truth, a truth which is true not because it is taught by another religion but simply because it *is* true, they are responding to grace and are partially members of the one Church of Christ!

But the same principle applies to them just as it did to the atheist. If they stay in their religion and fail to discover the Christian truths of salvation in an explicit way because they are stubborn or close-minded, then we have a problem. But if, "through no fault of their own," they fail to discover these truths but only seek the truths of God that just so happen to also be in their religion, then they too are on the road to salvation and are, to a certain degree, members of the Church.

Non-Catholic Christians are the same way. They know Christ Jesus. They have the Scriptures. They pray and worship the Triune God. But they do fail to grasp certain aspects of the fullness of faith. They also are members of the one Church of Christ insofar as they are united to the truths of the faith.

And, truth be told, just because someone is Catholic does not mean they are necessarily a full member of the Church of Christ either. It's not enough to be Catholic in name. It must be in practice.

Lastly, it must be said that those who have been entrusted with the Gospel, especially those Catholics entrusted with the fullness of the faith, are called to spread the explicit message of our faith so as to bring everyone into the Church of Christ and even into the Catholic Church itself. We are called to be missionaries at home, at work, abroad, in the public square and everywhere. We need to understand that it is our duty and privilege to share the Good News with all!

In the end, all are welcome and all are called to come to the fullness of faith in Christ and to live it not only in their conscience but also explicitly, proclaiming the full truths of faith. This is the mission of all and reveals the true meaning of the word "catholic."


May your Mother Mary intercede for us and may the Archangel Michael defend us in battle. We make our payer through Christ our Lord and Redeemer. Amen.


NEVER LET ONE FAILURE FROM THE PAST HOLD YOU BACK IN THE FUTURE
