### **TODAY'S READINGS**

*First Reading:* Acts 8:5-8, 14-17: The people of Samaria accept the Gospel of Jesus proclaimed to them by Philip.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 66:1-7, 16, 20 CRY OUT WITH JOY TO GOD, ALL THE EARTH.

**Second Reading:** 1Pt 3:15-18: Be ready to give explanation for your hope in Christ.

**Gospel Reading:** In 14:15-21: Jesus promises his disciples that he will send them another advocate, the Spirit of truth.

#### REFLECTION

In today's reading Jesus contrasts his impending departure with the permanence of the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus will leave to return to the Father, but the Holy Spirit will remain with the disciples. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, the disciples will come to know and appreciate the unity of the Son and the Father. They will also understand that they too participate in the communion between the Father and the Son: "On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you" (John 14:20). Today's reading is one example of the contrast that John's Gospel presents between the community of disciples, to whom God will reveal himself, and the unbelieving world, which will remain in darkness. The unbelieving world cannot accept the "Spirit of truth," whom the disciples will receive. Only through the Spirit will God's revelation and love be known.

### THE CHURCH'S TEACHING ON HOMOSEXUALITY

(Continued from last week)

### The Church's Position on Homosexuality

The Church sees its teaching on homosexuality as based on the solid foundation of a constant biblical testimony. From the Church's point of view, the basis for understanding the entire discussion of homosexuality is the theology of creation as found in Genesis. God fashions mankind, male and female, in his own image and likeness.

The male and female sexes complement each other, and men and women are called to reflect the inner unity of the Creator. They do this in a striking way in their cooperation with him in the transmission of life by a mutual giving of the self to the other. The Church sees the practice of homosexuality as something condemned by the Scriptures and cites in its documents the passages mentioned above. The Church's teaching on homosexuality can be summarized as follows:

- (1) A distinction must be made between "the homosexual condition or tendency" and "individual homosexual actions." The latter is "intrinsically disordered" and is "in no case to be approved of" In other words, while the Church does not condemn people for being homosexuals, it condemns the homosexual acts that homosexuals perform.
- (2) Although the particular inclination of the homosexual person is not a sin, it is a more or less strong tendency ordered towards an intrinsic moral evil, and thus the inclination itself must be seen as an objective disorder.
- (3) To choose someone of the same sex for one's sexual activity is to annul the rich symbolism and meaning, not to mention the goals, of the Creator's sexual design. Homosexual activity is not a complementary union, able to transmit life, and so it thwarts the call to a life of that form of self-giving which the Gospel says is the essence of Christian living.
- (4) We must reject the unfounded and demeaning assumption that the sexual behaviour of homosexual persons is always and totally compulsive and therefore inculpable. The homosexual also must be seen as having the fundamental liberty which characterizes the human person and gives him his dignity.
- (5) It is deplorable that homosexual persons have been and are the object of violent malice in speech or in action. Such treatment must be condemned by the Church's pastors wherever it occurs. It portrays a kind of disregard for others which endangers the most fundamental principles of a healthy society. The intrinsic dignity of each person must always be respected in word, in action and in law. Homosexuals must be accepted with respect, compassion and sensitivity. Every sign of unjust discrimination in their regard should be avoided.

#### **YOUTH ENTREPRENEURSHIP - Part 1**

The African population is consistently growing exponentially and is said to increase to about 300 million young people by the next two decades. (MasterCard Foundation, Young Africa Works Strategy). That will mean an increase in the workforce and the demand for sustainable jobs. However, the economies of most African countries are not growing at equal magnitude. There are fewer formal sector jobs to accommodate the teeming population. Many reasons account for this problem. We can mention bad economic policies, corruption, and structural economic challenges dating back to colonial times. These are but to mention a few. Whatever the reason, unemployment is high, and immediate solutions are needed. So what is the way forward?

Recently, Finance Minister Ken Ofori Atta of Ghana charged the youth to consider venturing into entrepreneurship as an alternative to formal sector jobs. He disclosed that the government payroll was reaching its maximum limit and thus suggesting that the government had little money to fund the creation of more formal sector jobs for the youth. While this call sparked a lot of debate, it renewed the calls of those schools of thought that considered entrepreneurship as the best way of solving Africa's employment crisis.

This article agrees with the assertion above and will make suggestions to governments on how entrepreneurship can be a lucrative venture for young people.
