TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Is 5:1-7: The Lord compares the house of Israel to a vineyard.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 80:9, 12-16, 19-20 The Vineyard of the Lord of Host is the House of Israel.

Second Reading: Phil 4:6-9: Paul encourages the Philippians to stay faithful to the teaching they received from him.

Gospel Reading: Mt 21:33-43: Jesus tells the parable about the wicked tenants.

REFLECTION

The gospel of today draws our attention to the householder who planted a vineyard and equipped it with all the necessary logistics to make it easier for any person who would work in the vineyard. He later leased it to tenants, only to demand an account of the work done by them. The householder is God, the vineyard is the Church, and the tenants are we, the baptized faithful. God has endowed the church with every resource we need as tenants of the Church to bear good fruit. These resources are the doctrines, the sacraments, the faith, the moral values, and the various retreats and spiritual programmes of the church that have been given to us freely. What God demands of us when the season of fruit draws near, is to bear fruits of love, piety, truthfulness, generosity, selflessness, and others. However, since we are often not forthcoming in bearing these fruits, we are always in a defensive mood to attack. Furthermore, our sinful rebellious acts, which often produce vices instead of virtues, make us crucify Christ regardless of the number of times Christ visits us in sacraments and especially in the Eucharist. We depict the attitude of the tenants who killed the son of the householder who was sent to them. Remember what God demands of us: to be responsible tenants who will always be ready to give a proper account of the fruits we have produced out of the abundance of the riches we have acquired from the vineyard.

THE CONFITEOR

Confiteor is a Latin word that means "I confess," the first words of the prayer that we now say together. This is a public confession. There are only sinners present in the church today. Everyone—priest, deacon, and all gathered—says the words together.

This prayer is directed not only to God but also to everyone present, including the people around us. We acknowledge our act of separation has occurred through our fault, emphasizing this by striking our breasts. We have sinned in our minds, in our hearts, in our actions, and, worst of all, in what we have done. Our confession is an admission that we are in desperate need of a savior. We open our hearts with this generation confession to all gathered that we, like them, are in need of someone to excuse us from our plight. The wages of sin, or sin, is death.

Our sins have other consequences than those felt in the here and now. Our sins create discord, sow fear, and cause great pain. They create a living hell for those around us and even in us. Not only do we need a savior who can recuse us, but we also need a savior who can empower us to live differently.

PRAYER FOR GOD'S INTERVENTION IN OUR LAND CASE

Almighty and Merciful Father, we thank you for our faith and for the gift of our church community. We thank you for how far you have brought us as a parish. You have been our refuge in times past and our hope for years to come.


May your Mother Mary intercede for us and may the Archangel Michael defend us in battle. We make our payer through Christ our Lord and Redeemer.

MOTIVATION


THE SLAVE AND THE LION
