TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Prov 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31: The virtues of a good wife are extolled.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 128:1-5128:1-5

BLESSED ARE ALL WHO FEAR THE LORD.

Second Reading: 1Thes 5:1-6: Paul warns the Thessalonians to stay alert because the day of the Lord cannot be predicted.

Gospel Reading: Mt 25:14-30 or 25:14-15, 19-21: Jesus tells the parable of the talents, in which he teaches about the importance of using the gifts that God has given to us in service to the Kingdom of Heaven.

REFLECTION

Beloved, God calls upon us to actively utilize the gifts He bestows upon us. It's important to recognize that these gifts are not our possessions but rather entrusted to us by God for the greater good of all. It is our responsibility to ensure that these gifts, in accordance with our abilities, are diligently employed in due time. This principle is exemplified in the parable found in Matthew 25:14–30, where a man entrusts his talents to his servants. Our efforts to make the most of our talents, not only for our benefit but for the benefit of all, demonstrate our faithfulness and diligence as servants of God. In line with the commendation received by the first two servants in the parable. God will honour our efforts with His grace and entrust us with greater responsibility for being trustworthy servants. It's crucial to remember that no gift is insignificant in the eyes of God and, as such, it is incumbent upon us to utilize our gifts and not allow them to go to waste. Failing to do so would be an expression of ingratitude towards God, as demonstrated by the servant with one talent in the parable.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

In One God: There is only one God. Christians hold the belief in one God, along with Jews and Muslims. It is important to note that our statement of belief does not say we believe in three Gods. Many good Christians misunderstand the Church's belief in the Trinity (stating belief in one God, but often acting like there are three).

When Philip asked Jesus to show the Father to the apostles, Jesus responded that anyone who had seen Him had seen the Father. It is important to remember that and to understand that Jesus has revealed God perfectly to us.

In Jesus Christ: Belief in Jesus is still belief in one God. The Lord became one of us, taking on human flesh and becoming fully human but still fully God as well. This is a mystery, and attempts to simplify its teaching are often heretical.

The creed reaches its zenith when we state that, for our salvation, God became one of us and was made man. We make a profound bow to honor the supreme mystery of God becoming one of us at the words "By the Holy Spirit, he was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man". This is still done during the praying of the creed on the solemnity of the Annunciation and at Christmas. Both are feasts of the Church that celebrate the mystery of God becoming one of us, one at His conception and the other at His birth. During the rest of the Church year, we make a solemn bow. This mystery is called the Incarnation, a word that means "taking on human flesh"; in this case, God taking on our human flesh in Jesus Christ.

Because everything depends upon this act of our Lord and makes our salvation possible, the final part of the creed celebrates the grace that we received from our Lord's death and Resurrection.

PRAYER FOR GOD'S INTERVENTION IN OUR LAND CASE

Almighty and Merciful Father, we thank you for our faith and for the gift of our church community. We thank you for how far you have brought us as a parish. You have been our refuge in times past and our hope for years to come.

We humbly beseech you to help us win back our Land in this dispute. Save us from violence, discord and confusion and the evil plans of our adversaries.

For the Court of Justice, we pray that you will give them the spirit of Wisdom and Understanding that they may discern the truth and impartially administer the law in the fear of you alone. May they not yield to deceit and acts of bribery and corruption but uphold the truth and let justice prevail.

May your Mother Mary intercede for us and may the Archangel Michael defend us in battle. We make our payer through Christ our Lord and Redeemer.

MOTIVATION
