TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Ex 20:1-17: Moses is given the Ten Commandments

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 19:8, 9, 10, 11 LORD, YOU HAVE THE WORDS OF ETERNAL LIFE.

Second Reading: **1Cor 1:33-25:** Paul preaches Christ crucified to the Corinthians.

Gospel Reading: Jn 2:13-25: Jesus drives out the moneychangers from the Temple and says that he will destroy the temple and raise it up again.

REFLECTION

Beloved, awareness of our surroundings must guide our behaviour, particularly within the church. What might be deemed acceptable in other environments-such as the workplace, market, home, or school—may not align with the standards expected within the sacred space of the Church. Actions that appear harmless elsewhere can be viewed as scandalous when enacted within these sacred walls. Consider the incident in John's gospel (John 2:13-25), where Jesus, witnessing profane activities in the temple, expressed righteous anger. Money changers and traders were expelled from the temple for conducting worldly business within His Father's House. The priests, entrusted with sacred duties, were complicit in these dishonourable transactions, prioritizing profit over reverence. While our actions may not mirror these scandalous examples, engaging in mundane activities such as eating, drinking, using phones, and playing profane music within the church desecrates its sanctity. Such behaviours set a detrimental example, especially for vulnerable young observers, who may mimic what they see without understanding the gravity of their actions. Let us, therefore, uphold the sacredness of the Church through our attitudes and actions, honouring the reverence owed to this holy sanctuary.

KNOW MORE ABOUT YOUR FAITH

SEVEN BENEFITS OF PRAYING THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS – Continued from Last Week

This devotion is usually on Fridays, especially during Lent. You may wonder, what are the benefits of praying *The Stations of the Cross*?

1. We can look at suffering from a different perspective.

Our Lord understands our struggles and gives us the grace we need to bear them well. We can learn how to do this from His example. He endured His suffering with patience, dignity, and humility. Jesus never stopped loving, forgiving, and praying for his persecutors. Even though the situation was so intense, He obeyed God's Will. His response to such an extreme situation was one of love. He endured it for our salvation. From His example, we can learn to love with humility and patience despite our broken world.

2. Praying this devotion helps us grow in our love for God.

We can express our love for Him as we pray the stations. It reminds us that we are not alone in our struggles. Jesus chose to embrace every aspect of human life, including suffering and death. He embraced human suffering on the Cross in a way no one else ever had before Him or ever will again. He made it redemptive by conquering evil with good. Through grace and our union with His suffering, we can learn to offer up our struggles out of love for others.

3. Praying the stations helps us to become holy.

We learn to have more compassion for those who suffer. It pulls us out of our selfishness and teaches us to sacrifice for others. We can learn to be patient in situations of unavoidable suffering. It helps us to examine our conscience. We can think about how we have sinned, how it makes our Lord suffer, and then have remorse.

4. We learn to hope in the promise of salvation.

Christ's promise of salvation far outweighed the horrors he had to endure. His suffering was redemptive not because it was full of pain but because He endured it with great love. When we unite our struggles with our wounded Saviour, we can learn to bear them well. We can find courage and strength in times of difficulty because of His merciful love. We can trust in Him.

PRAYER FOR GOD'S INTERVENTION IN OUR LAND CASE

Almighty and Merciful Father, we thank you for our faith and for the gift of our church community. We thank you for how far you have brought us as a parish. You have been our refuge in times past and our hope for years to come.

We humbly beseech you to help us win back our Land in this dispute. Save us from violence, discord and confusion and the evil plans of our adversaries.

For the Court of Justice, we pray that you will give them the spirit of Wisdom and Understanding that they may discern the truth and impartially administer the law in the fear of you alone. May your Mother Mary intercede for us and may the Archangel Michael defend us in battle. We make our payer through Christ our Lord and Redeemer. Amen.
