TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: **2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23:** The causes for the Israelites' captivity in Babylon are described.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 137:1-2, 3, 4-5, 6

LET MY TONGUE CLEAVE TO MY PALATE IF I REMEMBER YOU NOT.

Second Reading: Eph 2:4-10: In grace we have been saved, so that we may do the work of the Lord.

Gospel Reading: Jn 3:14-21: Jesus tells Nicodemus that the Son of Man will be raised up so that those who believe in him will have eternal life.

REFLECTION

Today marks the fourth Sunday of Lent, known as "Laetare Sunday" or "Rejoicing Sunday." This day serves as a reminder to fortify our commitment to Lenten observance in preparation for the upcoming joyous Easter Season, which is closer than we may realize. To achieve this, we are urged to maintain unwavering focus, keeping our gaze fixed on the cross—a powerful symbol of our redemption. Similar to how the bronze snake lifted by Moses in the wilderness brought healing to the bitten Israelites, our faith in Christ, who will be lifted on the cross on "Good Friday," ensures our ongoing salvation (John 3:14-15). We must walk in the light of Christ, especially during this season, and reject all forms of darkness that lead us to love and commit evil deeds (John 3:19–20). As we approach Easter, let us purge ourselves of the vices that poison our thoughts and actions, eradicating the inclination to harbour ill will towards others or indulge in sinful behaviours. As we approach the Easter season, let us beseech God for the grace to overcome these vices, ensuring that our hearts and minds are pure as we embrace the joyous resurrection of our Savior.

KNOW MORE ABOUT YOUR FAITH

LAETARE SUNDAY- ROMAN CATHOLICISM'S FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT.

Laetare is the first word — meaning "rejoice" — in the Latin text. On Laetare Sunday (as similar to the Third Sunday of Advent's Gaudete Sunday) the Church expresses hope and joy amid our Lenten fasts and penances. The colour pink, or more fittingly, rose is used. This colour change indicates a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide.

The day's theme comes from the entrance antiphon reflecting on Isaiah 66:10-11: "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast."

The joy of Easter being around the corner is symbolized in a few other interesting liturgical possibilities. During Lent, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal forbids flowers adorning the altar. But on Laetare Sunday (as well as solemnities and feasts within the season), there's a temporary halt to these penitential observations!

Laetare Sunday is the Church's way of giving us a "shot in the arm" as we approach the darkness and horror of the days through Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It's an opportunity to savor and keep in the back of our minds what awaits us on Easter Sunday — the reality that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead and that our hearts will always be filled with joy!

Being aware of traditions and customs assists us in celebrating the beauty of our faith. As you can see, there is much associated with even a nondescript day like the Fourth Sunday of Lent — not to mention the rest of the season, or the 50 days of Easter and beyond. Take advantage of the richness of our Catholic traditions.



MOTIVATION

THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS

There was once a group of 100 people attending a seminar on personal development. In the middle of their talk, the speaker stops and decides to run an impromptu group activity. He hands out a balloon to each attendee and tells them to write their name on it. The balloons are then collected and placed in an adjacent room.

The speaker then instructs the 100 attendees to enter that room and, within 5 short minutes, find the balloon with their name on it. Pandemonium breaks loose as they charge in, pushing and colliding with each other as they desperately search for their name. The 5 minutes pass and nobody succeeds. The speaker then tells each person to pick up any random balloon and give it to the person whose name is written on it. Within a few minutes, everyone has their balloon back. He then said, "What just happened with those balloons is exactly what happens in our search for happiness. We frantically look for it all around us, not knowing where it is.". "Yet our happiness lies in the happiness of others. By giving them their happiness, you get yours."

Moral: Happiness and fulfillment rarely come from selfish pursuits, but almost always come from doing good deeds for others. By helping others, we help ourselves.

RALLYING AROUND THE RED, YELLOW, BLACK AND GREEN

Between December 24th, 2023 and January 10th, 2024, Ghana witnessed a unique national rally thanks to two Guinness World Record contenders - Afua Asantewaa (Sing-a-ton) and Chef Faila (Cook-a-ton).

While I greatly appreciate and commend their efforts, the more important lesson for me is what their record-breaking efforts proved to us- Ghanaians can still rally behind the flag! Watching the scenes of crowd support and cheer at these events, I momentarily felt I was watching Nkrumah's famous Declaration of Independence and the sheer support it had received. I said to myself, there it is, what I thought was missing- the evidence of its silent presence, the spirit of patriotism.

Our country is currently suffering from a lack of patriotism. For various reasons such as justice, underdevelopment, unemployment and the over-amassing of wealth by the political class, many have lost hope and have resulted to the "me" vs "them" mentality, as famously expressed by Chinua Achebe in his book, No longer at Ease. Many Ghanaians feel isolated from the government and are willing to do anything to make money, even if it means selling out their country. The Galamsey crisis is a prime example of this.

The absence of sincere and effective leadership is a significant factor in our current situation. In my opinion, for our country to move forward, we need robust institutions that can withstand challenges. However, to create such
