TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43: Peter preaches about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

THIS IS THE DAY THE LORD HAS MADE; LET **US REJOICE IN IT AND BE GLAD.**

Second Reading: Col 3:1-4: Having been raised by Christ, be concerned with what is above.

Gospel Reading: Jn 20:1-9: Mary of Magdala finds that the stone has been removed from Jesus' tomb.

REFLECTION

On this significant day in the life of the church, Easter Sunday, we rejoice in the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ over death. His resurrection, accomplished through the redeeming power of His blood, dispels the darkness of sin that once overshadowed humanity. As Catholics, we celebrate this occasion with profound joy, steadfast in our belief in the power of our Lord. We must not overlook the significance of Mary Magdalene's initial doubt and fear. However, we must also recognize that she momentarily forgot the authority of the man she loved and believed in—Jesus, who possesses power over all, including death and sin. Upon discovering the empty tomb and witnessing the stone rolled away, Mary's initial reaction was one of sadness and confusion, prompting her to inform the other disciples. In contrast to Mary's initial reaction, our faith in the resurrection of Jesus should mirror that of the disciple John. Having personally witnessed the evidence of Christ's absence from the tomb, John's belief transcended mere affection for his Lord. He embraced the prophecy of Jesus' resurrection with unwavering faith. As we commemorate Easter, let us reflect on the profound significance of Christ's resurrection. Our proclamation and faith in Him are not in vain, for His triumph over death assures us of eternal hope and redemption.

KNOW MORE ABOUT YOUR FAITH

EASTER IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Many people think that Christmas is the most important day in the Catholic liturgical calendar, but from the earliest days of the Church, Easter has been considered the central Christian feast. As Saint Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 15:14, "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain." Without Easter—without the Resurrection of Christ—there would be no Christian Faith. Christ's Resurrection is the proof of His Divinity.

Easter is not only the greatest Christian feast; Easter Sunday symbolizes the fulfillment of our faith as Christians. Through His Death, Christ destroyed our bondage to sin; through His Resurrection, He brought us the promise of new life, both in Heaven and on earth. His own prayer, "Thy Kingdom come, on earth as it is in Heaven," begins to be fulfilled on Easter Sunday.

That is why new converts are traditionally brought into the Church through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion) at the Easter Vigil service, on Holy Saturday evening. Their baptism parallels Christ's own Death and Resurrection, as they die to sin and rise to new life in the Kingdom of God.

What Is the Easter Duty?

Most Catholics today receive Holy Communion each time they go to Mass, but that wasn't always the case. In fact, for a variety of reasons, many Catholics in the past very rarely received the Eucharist. Therefore, the Catholic Church made it a requirement for all Catholics to receive Communion at least once per year, during the Easter season. The Church also urges the faithful to receive the Sacrament of Confession in preparation for Easter Communion, though you're only required to go to Confession if you have committed a mortal sin. This reception of the Eucharist is a visible sign of our faith and our participation in the Kingdom of God. Of course, we should receive Communion as frequently as possible; this "Easter Duty" is simply the minimum requirement set by the Church.

Just as Easter is the most important Christian holiday, so, too, the Easter season is the longest of the special liturgical seasons of the Church. It extends all the way to **Pentecost Sunday**, the 50th day after Easter, and encompasses such major feasts as **Divine Mercy Sunday** and **Ascension**.

In fact, Easter sends ripples out through the liturgical calendar even after the Easter season ends. **Trinity Sunday** and the feast of **Corpus Christi**, which both fall after Pentecost, are "moveable feasts," which means that their date in any given year depends on

We humbly beseech you to help us win back our Land in this dispute. Save us from violence, discord and confusion and the evil plans of our adversaries.



Amen.


