TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Acts 3:13-15, 17-19: Peter preaches that Jesus has been raised from the dead and calls upon the people to repent.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 4:2, 4, 7-8, 9

LIFT UP THE LIGHT OF YOUR FACE ON US, O LORD.

Second Reading: 1Jn 2:1-5a: Those who know God keep his commandments.

Gospel Reading: Lk 24:35-48: Jesus appears again to his disciples and shares a meal with them.

REFLECTION

As faithful Catholics, how deeply do we understand the risen Lord, given our years of devotion? In today's Gospel, we are reminded of the disciples' initial inability to recognize the Lord, only to later come to know and believe in Him through the breaking of the bread. This sacred act, a mystery we encounter in the Mass, should prompt us to reflect on whether it has indeed strengthened our connection with the Lord, as it is intended to do. Similarly, when some disciples doubted and questioned whether they were seeing a spirit rather than the glorified body of the Lord, their disbelief was dispelled when He shared a meal with them. This echoes the experience of the two disciples who first encountered the risen Lord. From this, we learn that the most profound way to know, believe in, and dispel doubts about the risen Lord is through the Mass, where we are given all we need to understand Him. The Mass stands as the source and summit of our spiritual lives as Catholics. Therefore, let us make a conscious effort to actively participate in Mass, so that we may deepen our knowledge and connection with the Lord.

THE EASTER SEASON LASTS 50 DAYS

Easter lasts for a total of 50 days, from Easter Sunday until the **Feast of Pentecost**, when the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Christ. This year, 2024, Easter was on March 31 and runs until Pentecost Sunday, May 19.

Easter explained

The entire Easter season lasts 50 days and includes the solemnity of the Ascension of Christ, which falls on the 40th day of Easter, and ends with Pentecost, which is derived from the Greek word "pentecoste," meaning "50th."

Ascensiontide begins the evening before the Ascension, with the first vespers of the feast, and ends the afternoon of the vigil of Pentecost — marking the first novena. There is seven full weeks after Easter Sunday! Indeed, for the purpose of fulfilling our Easter Duty (the requirement to receive <u>Communion</u> at least once during the Easter season),

"The 50 days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day, indeed as one 'great Sunday,'". "These are the days above all others in which the 'Alleluia' is sung." "It celebrates Jesus' victory of sin and death and salvation for mankind

• In the Traditional Roman Rite

In the traditional form of the Roman rite, Easter is known properly as Paschaltide, which includes three parts: the season of Easter, Ascensiontide, and the octave of Pentecost. It thus lasts one week longer than the Easter season in the calendar of the Missal of St. Paul VI.

We humbly beseech you to help us win back our Land in this dispute. Save us from violence, discord and confusion and the evil plans of our adversaries.


